HEARING CARE FOR CHILDREN

Dr. Chong Foong Yen, Audiologist and Senior Lecturer from UKM, presented a hybrid talk on "Hearing Care for Children with Down Syndrome" on 22 October 2024. Her informative session covered the hearing system and emphasized the importance of regular audiological tests for children with Down syndrome, providing parents with essential knowledge. A total of 19 parents attended, with 8 joining in person and 11 participating online.






Sing & Play with Your Child

Jessie conducted two sessions of "Sing & Play with Your Child" for KDSF parents on 5th and 7th November. Through classroom observations, pull-out sessions, and discussions with teachers, therapists, and parents, she identified strategies to support parents in enhancing their child's language development. A total of 14 parents attended the first session, and 10 parents participated in the second.









PROGRAM PENDIDIKAN KHAS PINTEGRASI (PPKI)

On 18 July 2024, KDSFNC hosted an informative talk on the Program Pendidikan Khas Integrasi (PPKI) with speakers from SK Damansara Jaya 1, SK Subang Bestari, and SJK (C) Sam Yoke. The session covered PPKI objectives, registration, program structure, and support strategies for children with Down syndrome. The parents felt that the event is insightful.

As a follow-up, on 15 October 2024, 17 SRP students and nearly 30 parents visited PPKI SJKC Sam Yoke. The children joined PPKI students for snack time and an activity, while parents attended a briefing that concluded with a school tour. These efforts aim to provide exposure for parents and give students firsthand experience as they transition to primary school.











LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT



MAKATON WORKSHOP



On 20 July 2024, our team - Ashwini, Felissa, Azra, Hajar, and Jessie – attended a Makaton Communication workshop by Malaysian Care. From 9am to 3pm, they learned Makaton Levels 1 & 2, expanding their vocabulary and communication skills. The event, with approximately 25 participants, included staff from Malaysian Care, parents of children with Down syndrome, KDSF staff, and educators from early intervention centres. It was both enjoyable and insightful.















9TH NATIONAL EARLY CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION CONFERENCE

The KDSFNC team—Teacher Adlina, Azra, Christv. Hajar, and Lee Sook Foong—attended a conference from 14-16 September 2024, focusing on Family-Centred Practices and Strength-Based Approaches in supporting children with special needs. A key highlight of the event was the launch of Small Steps, Big Changes for Preschool Inclusion: Toolbox of Strategies to Implement Inclusive Education by Na Lai-Thin.

LET'S Let's Talk COMMUNICATE

On 6 August 2024, Teacher Rosnah, Teacher Mary, and Teacher Jessie attended the Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) workshop titled "Let's Communicate," organized by Hospital Putrajaya. The workshop explored various AAC tools, the rationale behind using AAC, and included a hands-on session on creating a communication board using BoardMaker.

30 YEARS WITH KDSFJB

On January 10, 1995, I began my journey as a teacher's assistant at KDSF-JB, then located on Jalan Abdul Samad. That day marked the start of my career in teaching special needs children. Alongside teachers who had already been serving there for four years since the centre's opening in Johor Bahru, I learned a great deal-especially from the parents of the students. At just 21 years old, I was exposed to knowledge and experiences I had never encountered before, shaping me into the person I am today.

Ms. Ping, Teacher Sally, and Ms. Gowri were among the individuals who became close friends when I first started working. I learned a lot from headteacher Ms. Ping, who guided me in effective teaching methods and approaches for children with special needs.


She also gave me opportunities and space to try new things, such as planning dances and performances for the students, which we organized to promote our centre at various locations. She fully trusted me to create and illustrate children's storybooks for story time, and I was also the first teacher to propose creating worksheets for students who were ready to write—an idea that is still used today.



Additionally, I was trained to babies with handle Syndrome under the guidance of a physiotherapist from Sultanah

Aminah Hospital. This invaluable experience deepened my understanding of child development and milestones. I also began attending various courses that expanded my theoretical and practical knowledge of teaching children with special needs.

After three years of working, I embarked on a new chapter in my life as a wife. A special reception dinner was held with KDSF-JB's committee members, teachers, parents, and children. I felt incredibly lucky to be surrounded by such wonderful people who celebrated our marriage. Their blessings and prayers have stayed with us to this day.

In 1997, our centre moved to Jalan Yahya Awal, where we continued to grow, welcoming new teachers, students, and parents. Over the years, many students graduated and continued their education in special education classes at mainstream schools. I was actively involved in organizing various programs such as charity sales and buddy walks, which not only enriched my experience but also strengthened my engagement with the community. These events helped me connect with people from all walks of life, regardless of their status or abilities.





Ten years later, we moved to Majidee Park. Thanks to the dedication of Kiwanis members from the Kiwanis Club of Johor Bahru, funds were successfully raised to build our own centre. Although the transition was challenging, we overcame every obstacle with the help of parents, Kiwanians, and teachers. Our new, more comfortable learning environment provided dedicated spaces that allowed for a more structured and organized teaching approach. We were also able to introduce new skills, such as baking classes for Group 1 (SAP) and Group 2 (SRP).

At the end of 2019, Ms. Ping retired, and the responsibility of managing the centre was placed on my shoulders. It was a significant challenge, and initially, I was unsure if I could handle it. However, with the trust of the management committee and the unwavering support of my fellow teachers, I did my best to lead the centre in accordance with the established framework.

A greater challenge arrived when the COVID-19 pandemic struck in 2020. As teachers, we worked tirelessly to ensure that classes continued online, staying connected with students and their parents, monitoring their progress, and addressing any issues that arose during remote learning. Once the pandemic ended, it became a chapter in our history—a period of resilience and adaptation. Schools reopened, students returned, and daily routines resumed.

ENGAGEMENT & COLLABORATION WITH KDSF-KLANG

AUDIOLOGY CHECK

On 14 October 2024, Ms. Nur Aisyah Nadjwa, a Master's student from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), conducted research at the center on "Investigating Middle Ear Function and its Effects on Real-Ear-To-Coupler Difference (RECD) Measurement Among Children with Down Syndrome (DS)." This study provided valuable insights into the children's hearing levels, leading to recommendations for further treatment for eight students, ultimately benefiting their overall well-being.



ENRICHING VISITATIONS

EXPLORING DANCE SEQUENCES FOR GROWTH

Ms. Mak Foong Ming from Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) is conducting a research study titled "The Development and Effectiveness of Contemporary Dance Sequences on Gross Motor and Living Skills Among Children with Down Syndrome in Malaysia." This study will take place at the center for at least 10 weeks, running daily from September to December. The research aims to explore how contemporary dance sequences can enhance the gross motor and daily living skills of children with Down Syndrome, contributing valuable insights to the field of special education and therapy.


